

Guide to Liverpool Music



Beatles Story - First stop has to be The Beatles Story in Albert Dock, a fantastic museum-cum-visitor attraction full of Beatles paraphernalia that is dedicated to The Fab Four. The Beatles Story follows John, Paul, George and Ringo from their early beginnings to global Beatlemania and beyond. Allow several hours, there is so much to see there.

Magical Mystery Tour - Fans of The Beatles should also head to Albert Dock which is the starting point for the Magical Mystery Tour, a bus trip taking in various Beatles landmarks including Penny Lane and Strawberry Fields.



Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra - The RLPO is led by the youthful, charismatic Russian chief conductor Vasily Petrenko, who was awarded the Classical BRIT Awards Male Artist of the Year in 2010 and whom Liverpool has adopted as one of their own. Concerts at the Liverpool Philharmonic Hall include full-blown orchestral pieces and an incredible range of symphonic concerts and visiting performances.

The Cavern - Anyone coming to Liverpool for The Beatles should stop off at The Cavern Club on Mathew Street in the city centre. The Cavern was where The Beatles first started out, and although the original Club hasn't survived, the current Cavern occupies about three-quarters of the original space and houses the original brickwork (the reconstructed archway) to take you back to the Mersey Beat era.



Gospel Choir – performing regularly at Alma de Cuba, a truly memorable restaurant and bar thanks partly thanks to its origins as a Polish Church



Casbah Coffee Club – a fully restored venue, visitors can look around the club where The Beatles started out in the late 1950s and before they were famous.

Green Room – one of the newest additions to the Liverpool music scene is this cabaret club which showcases musical and comedy acts.

Zanzibar – one of Liverpool's longest established music venues, there is live music on almost every night with pay-on-the-door entry. Many local bands cut their teeth here so why not take pot luck and go along...who knows, you may make a discovery!

Cathedral Choirs – both the city's cathedrals have several services a day

Echo Arena – artists that have performed at the Echo Arena Liverpool and enriched the Liverpool music scene include Elton John, Bob Dylan and Beyonce, while the Arena has staged a range of events that include the MTV Europe Music Awards, BBC Sports Personality of the Year, Cirque du Soleil and Davis Cup tennis.
